## ACCOMMODATION

Hotel: GLIDE-supported participants have reserved accommodation at the Anantara Eastern Mangroves Hotel for the duration of the Symposium. Breakfast is included throughout your stay. Before departure, participants should settle any expenses for extra days stayed and any other miscellaneous expenses. Self-paying participants may do so at the time of check-in and settle any outstanding balances with the hotel at checkout.

Meals: GLIDE will provide lunch during the two meeting days of the symposium at the 'Ingredients' Restaurant. A dinner reception will be held on the first day of the meeting (February 8th). Please note that GLIDE will not provide dinner on the last day of the meeting (February 9th).

## LOGISTICAL INFORMATION

**Transportation: Airport Transfers:** Airport pick-ups and ground transportation will only be arranged for participants supported by GLIDE. Please look for the driver holding a placard with your name on it.

**Taxis:** From Abu Dhabi International Airport to Anantara Eastern Mangroves costs approximately 40 – 60 AED (USD \$11 – 17) for a normal taxi.

The 150-kilometer trip from Dubai International Airport to Abu Dhabi city takes 90 minutes. Traffic has a significant impact on both the fare and the time, this greatly influences the final fare. The taxi ride from Dubai Airport to Abu Dhabi should cost approximately 329 AED (USD \$90). Almost all taxi drivers in Dubai have point-of-sale (POS) systems, payments can be made using credit or debit cards as well as cash (dirhams).

**Other:** When making a reservation, inquire about airport transfers as many hotels offer them. In addition to local taxis, Ubers operates in Abu Dhabi, along with a local provider, Careem.

## LOCAL INFORMATION

**Attire:** The dress code in Abu Dhabi does not impose restrictions. However, considering that UAE is an Islamic country and how important is to respect the traditions of a host country, in public places, such as streets or malls, it is recommended to avoid transparent clothes, skirts, and shorts, and cover up from the shoulders to the legs included for both men and women.

**Weather:** February averages with daytime highs of 24°C (75°F) and evening lows of 13°C (56°F).

**Electricity:** The standard frequency in the UAE is 50Hz, and the standard voltage is 220V. The G power plug type, which is a square three-pin, is commonly used. With a different power plug, it is advisable to carry a travel adapter, although some hotels provide plug converters.

**Currency:** The official currency in the UAE is the dirham (AED) equivalent to an exchange rate of 1 US\$ = approximately AED 3.67. VISA, Master cards, and international debit cards are widely accepted in most establishments. ATMs are widely available in banks, malls, and hotels for cash withdrawals.
