

# FALCON AWARDS FOR DISEASE ELIMINATION INTEGRATION EDIT

# **ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA**

This document outlines the eligibility criteria for applicants wishing to submit concepts for research projects or advocacy initiatives for the 2025 Falcon Awards.

## **OBJECTIVES**

All concepts should aim to meet one or more of the following objectives:

- 1. **Generating evidence\_and testing approaches\_**to advance the elimination of infectious diseases through integrated approaches.
- 2. **Disseminating knowledge** to enhance understanding and catalyse action for integrated disease elimination strategies.
- 3. **Supporting local or regional advocacy** efforts to advance integrated approaches to disease elimination.
- 4. Raising awareness of and for integrated disease elimination strategies and approaches.
- 5. **Cultivating partnerships** aimed at advancing elimination through integrated approaches that enhance knowledge or evidence around the transmission, control, elimination, and eradication of infectious diseases.

#### **TOPICS**

Concepts submitted should aim to advance integrated elimination strategies for infectious diseases that are cross-border, cross-sector, or cross-disease. Concepts may focus on, but are not limited to, the following sub-categories:

- 1. Pilot field projects on the integration of eliminable diseases
- 2. Mainstreaming eliminable diseases into national health systems
- 3. "Sustaining elimination" Post Validation Surveillance/preventing reintroduction
- 4. Community-centered approaches to disease elimination
- 5. One Health approaches to disease elimination
- 6. Innovative approaches to disease elimination
- 7. Investment cases for disease elimination

# **PROJECT DESIGN**

Concepts submitted must be able to start work in 2025.

### **ELIGIBLE APPLICANTS**

Applications must come from within an organisation or entity with demonstrated experience in disease elimination. The following entities are eligible to apply:

- 1. National or regional academic or research institutions
- 2. Government entities
- 3. Public, private or non-governmental sector institutions
- 4. Consortia, coalitions or networks may apply but must meaningfully include either an academic institution, Civil Society Organization (CSO), or Non-Governmental Organisations (NGO).
- 5. Early career researchers
